# Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

It's surprising, even scandalous, how many prophets in the Old Testament pray for death. Elijah does in this week's first reading. Moses did in last week's reading. Jeremiah, Job, Jonah, and others...all struggle with their burdens and ask to be relieved. Recall Saint Thomas' words: "Let us go to die with him."

Let me first say this: it's not "sinful," as the conventional wisdom might say, to contemplate death or even suicide. Many holy men and women, saints and the prophets above, thought about death and considered suicide. Christ himself contemplated his own death. In fact, he predicted it three times before dying.

It's important to acknowledge that the thought is okay. If we think the thought itself is sinful, then we'll simply repress it. We won't pray about it and the deeper issue or struggle we are facing won't have the opportunity to be addressed. The chances, then, are high we will do something we regret. Whereas if we don't condemn ourselves and feel shame, and just lift to the Lord our heavy hearts, like Elijah does when he prays under the broom tree, God will be able to speak his love and wisdom to us. We will be able to move forward.

We experience this reality in many other ways with temptations, bad thoughts, bad dreams, and so forth. We feel we are committing a sin by just having the thought or dream, and so we don't pray about it. Now, indulging the temptation or acting on the thought is a different story. But that's not what we're talking about. Praying about it isn't a sin. In fact, you can trust that God wants you to pray about the struggle you are having. That is how he will be close to you. Jesus calls himself the Bread of Life and says that whoever eats of him will not die and "will live forever." Praying about your heavy thoughts is incredibly helpful. Taking your heavy thoughts with you to Mass, laying them on the altar, and asking for help as you receive communion is even better.

The other day I was given a lesson by some Gen Z'ers in the usage of Gen Z slang. For instance, "mid" means mediocre. So, a Gen Z'er might say, "that homily was mid." Or, "bussin'" means really good: "that burger was bussin'." Well, when I was in high school and college, a common saying, sort of slang, was "I hate my life." You would say it when you were

given a 20-page paper to write or your football team lost. But over time people started saying it more frequently and actually meaning it.

If you've had that thought before—"I hate my life"—whether or not you truly meant it, I invite you to pray about it. Even better, I invite you to come to Mass on Sunday and offer it over to the Lord. You'll begin to love your life and see all the challenges as blessings.

## Community Reflections



### Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This is the fourth in the series of the Bread of Life Discourse by Jesus in the Gospel of John. In this section of the discourse, Jesus has already shifted from the spiritual sense of “I am the Bread of Life” to the more direct reference to his own body and blood: “the bread that I will give is my flesh.”

In today’s first reading, the same Elijah, who defeated Ahab, Jezebel, and Baal’s entire prophets, is afraid, discouraged and running for his life. He lost the hope of survival and thought that God had abandoned him. “I am alone in my struggle.” “I do not think God still hears my prayers,” “I feel like dying because it is too much for me to bear.” Like Elijah, some of us are on the run from different uncertainties of this life. We are saying or acting out the statement: “Lord, I have heard enough.” So, we can appreciate Elijah’s predicament. The Holy Spirit leads us to Christ, the living bread who nourishes and equally strengthens us for our journey.

In our second reading, Paul reminds us that as children of God, each one of us bears a mark of the Holy Spirit. This spirit is our guide, strength, and company in the Journey of life. So, we must trust and walk with him. If we trust and walk with him, he will lead us safely through the rough paths of life. He will lead us to Christ, the living bread who nourishes and strengthens us along our journey. Paul tells us how to maintain this relationship with the Holy Spirit. “Never have grudges against another, or lose your temper, or raise your voice to anybody, or call each other names... forgiving each other as readily as God forgave you in Christ.” Here are some practical ways to incorporate the concept of Jesus as the “bread of life” into your daily life:

1. **Morning Prayer:** Begin your day with a simple prayer, thanking Jesus for sustaining you physically and spiritually.
2. **Spiritual Hunger:** When you feel spiritually hungry or empty, turn to Jesus. Pray for His guidance, wisdom, and strength.
3. **Acts of Kindness:** Just as bread nourishes the body, perform acts of kindness and generosity. Share your “bread” with others—whether it’s a smile, a listening ear, or a helping hand.

### **Prayer to Mary while adoring Jesus in the Eucharist**

The Virgin Mary remains the prime example of how to adore Jesus in the Eucharist. The Virgin Mary was privileged above all saints to hold within herself, Jesus, the Son of God. In this way she was a living Tabernacle of God and lovingly adored Jesus in her womb, but also after birth. Her example of adoring love inspired St. Peter Julian Eymard to call her “Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament,” composing various prayers and reflections with her in mind. Here is one of his prayers that asks for Mary’s help in adoring our Lord, as she adored her Son.

O Mary, teach us the life of adoration! Teach us to find, as thou didst, all mysteries and all graces in the Eucharist, to live the Gospel over again, and to read it in the Eucharistic Life of Jesus! Remember, Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, that thou art the Mother of all adorers of the Holy Eucharist. Thou art blessed among women, Mary, and blessed is our Eucharistic Jesus, the fruit of thy womb!

## KNOW YOUR MARYVILLE

### MISSION

Maryville is a child care organization rooted in Catholic social teaching and dedicated to the preservation of the dignity of children at every age. Our mission is to protect children and strengthen families while helping them reach their fullest potential by empowering their intellectual, spiritual, moral and emotional growth.

Maryville Academy, one of Chicagoland's oldest social service organizations, began its 140th anniversary in July 2023. We are full of gratitude for all the Lord has accomplished for children, families and communities over the years through the dedication of countless clergy, religious, lay personnel and community partners. As an apostolate of the Archdiocese of Chicago, we share in the Church's works of mercy and thank you for the privilege of carrying out our mission to protect and serve children and families in your name and with your help. We appreciate this opportunity to reacquaint you with or introduce you to "your" Maryville.

Saint Mary's Training School was begun in 1883 by Chicago's first Archbishop, Reverend Patrick A. Feehan, and was renamed Maryville Academy by the children's vote in 1950. It has provided a home, education, career training and therapeutic care while upholding the dignity of each child. Over the years, as the needs and circumstances of youth changed, we responded with best-practice methods and programming. Yet we have held true to the essential mission, striving to make a positive difference.

Maryville is dedicated to protecting children and strengthening families through our comprehensive services in four key areas – Family Services, Residential Services, Healthcare Services, and Educational Services. These services are available in Bartlett, Berwyn, Chicago, Des Plaines, and Niles. Many of our programs are community-based and are designed to be of assistance to you, or those you know or serve:

- **Catholic Youth Organization (CYO):** 312-491-3534—provides a safe and positive environment for young athletes in Cook and Lake Counties through sports leagues/camps, open gyms and tournaments.
- **Children's Healthcare Center:** 773-205-3606—is a welcoming, supportive facility that offers 24-hour nursing care for children who are medically fragile and technology dependent. The nursing staff gives parent/caregiver training to safely transition the children back to their homes.
- **Crisis Nursery:** 24-Hour Helpline - 773-205-3637—one of seven in IL and the only one serving Cook and Lake counties. It offers free child care services to parents with children under age 7 who are experiencing an emergency or crisis. It provides a safe, secure and loving environment for 4–72 hours in one stay and up to 30 days a year.
- **Family Behavioral Health Clinic:** 847-390-3004—has counseling services, DUI evaluations, risk education (English, Spanish, and Polish, in-person or telehealth appointments), smoking/vaping cessation services and play therapy. Medicaid and private insurance (not HMO) are accepted. NARCAN training for groups is available.





- **Maryville Academy Mother’s Recovery Home Network (Saint Monica and Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes)** - 312-491-3500 | 872-250-9720—is a recovery and unification program that helps moms become sober, self-sufficient and independent so they can care for their children and keep them safe. Moms 18-35 years of age, accompanied by children younger than 11, receive recovery, vocational and parenting coaching. Referral is via the Department of Children and Family Services’ INTACT unit or from an assessment by our Family Behavioral Health Clinic.
- **Charles H. Walsh Sr. Academy & Career Tech High School:** 847-390-3020—opened in November 2023 and continues Maryville Jen School’s founding vision of preparing diverse learners to enter high-demand trades or be college-ready for a successful future. Walsh Academy has an open enrollment policy and welcomes students 14-22 who are within a one-hour driving distance from the Academy. It is a leader in providing a comprehensive curriculum that offers academics, integrated social-emotional learning, and career-technical educational instruction for students.

Maryville also continues to provide residential programs: **Casa Imani** and **St. Mary of Celle** are therapeutic homes for parenting and pregnant adolescent girls who experienced childhood trauma and are currently in the care of DCFS. **Casa Salama Home** for girls, 13-20, in DCFS care, diagnosed with cognitive and mental challenges. **St. Dominic Savio Home** and **St. Teresa of Calcutta Home** offer clinical care and life skills education for youth aged 14-18 who are referred to Maryville by the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice. **Casa Esperanza, St. Rose of Lima, San Francisco and San Juan Diego Homes** are short-term homes for newcomer youth displaced by war, violence or trauma. **St. Gabriel Home** is a long-term group home for male newcomer youth 12-17.

**Maryville Golf Academy**, one of Maryville’s family services programs, teaches life lessons inherent in golf to Maryville children and youth in underserved Chicago neighborhoods and helps them develop as players, caddies and clubmakers.

Maryville is blessed with 500 employees. Our funding comes from government contracts, grants, donations and fundraising. We are proud and appreciative of our Maryville staff and grateful for the donors, volunteers, faith communities and organizations who support our work.

We invite you to partner with us by praying each day for Maryville’s children, families and staff; holding a drive or taking up a collection to benefit Maryville; supporting our fundraisers; becoming a “Maryville Ambassador” to connect us with your parish; joining our team (go to [maryvilleacademy.org](http://maryvilleacademy.org) for job opportunities); volunteering for a few hours each week (please visit our website to apply); contacting DCFS for information to become foster or adoptive parents—some of our Maryville children need families; or inviting our outreach coordinator to speak to your faith community or parish ministry or group about Maryville.

Thank you for the privilege of serving with you to strengthen and help children and families so they are safe, healthy and supported in growing to their full potential. 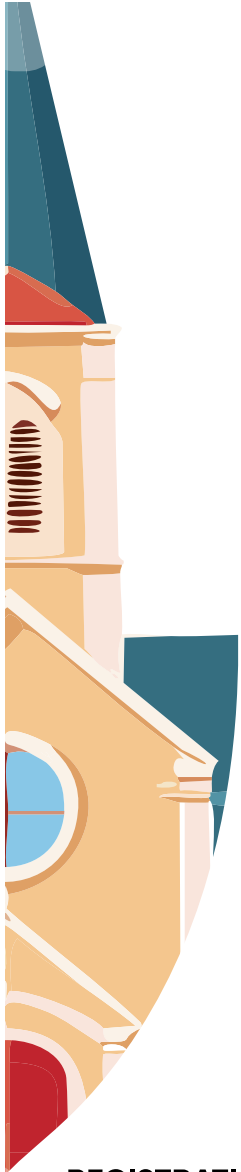

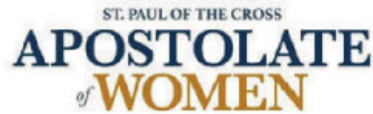

**Our Lady of the Angels Mission** – We sponsor and host Saturday community luncheons for over 150 people in the Humboldt Park community.

**Sunday Night Suppers** – We sponsor and host several community meals on Sunday nights.

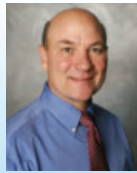
