

Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

A friend shared with me the other day this quote from the poet Rainer Marie Rilke:

"Death is our friend precisely because it brings us into absolute and passionate presence with all that is here, that is natural, that is love... Life always says Yes and No simultaneously. Death (I implore

you to believe) is the true Yea-sayer. It stands before eternity and says only: Yes."

The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone. It's a line we're all familiar with. St. Peter quotes it in his sermon from Acts of the Apostles in our second reading. It's from Psalm 118 and appears elsewhere throughout the scriptures. The rejected stone symbolizes death. Jesus died. The cornerstone doesn't vanish into nothingness. It becomes the cornerstone of some new and fantastic building. Jesus rose from the dead.

If we are called to be like Jesus, and Jesus is the rejected stone, then we too are called to be the rejected stone. We are the Rejected Stones (maybe a good name for a Rolling Stones cover band?). That is, we are called to face death and embrace it. When we die, we are raised.

Sure, I'm talking about our literal deaths. Whether you are in your 20s or your 80s, it's always a good idea to have your life in order and meditate on your death. Are you ready for it? Why or why not? Are you afraid? All things to pray and talk to Jesus about.

But there are other deaths we are called to face everyday, smaller "deaths" then the final death, but as important nonetheless. If we can embrace those deaths, becoming the rejected cornerstone, we will be saying "yes" to something great and opening ourselves up to a new horizon.

For example, I think of a married individual who is experiencing the "seven year itch" or a mid-life crisis. The honeymoon has worn off, they are tired or bored or frustrated with their spouse or job or home, and the temptation is to leave: find a new partner or change scenery somehow. To indulge that temptation is to avoid death, to avoid becoming the Rejected Stone.

Rather, the invitation in this situation for the

struggling partner/parent is to acknowledge the pain of the relationship and remain with the Lord in it. Don't give up on your marriage or your home. It's generally not the other spouse's fault or a problem with the current landscape. It's generally about us growing, surrendering, letting go of an old way of living. If we can let go of that old way of living, then we will become a cornerstone for something newer and better.

This is counter-cultural. The world tells us to always be happy and to change or eliminate that which brings us pain. This is why St. Paul says the cross is a stumbling block for many. The world would not have us die. Ironically, the world's way will cause us to die. "He who loses his life finds it, and he who preserves his life loses it," said our Lord.

There are many other examples we could give. The point is death is facing you in some way you're probably not recognizing immediately. Make friends with it. As Rilke says, death is the ultimate "Yea-sayer." And know that you're not alone in your struggle.

Community Reflections



I was meditating on the virtue of patience recently remarking at how elusive this gift is. We all agree it's a wise aspiration, but difficult to attain. Proverbs 14:29 states "whoever has patience has great understanding, but one who is quick tempered displays folly." When I prayed for clarity in my vocation it took years to discern the right path. I hear often of people telling me they pray for something and it seems nothing changes or the result seemed fruitless. I struggle with patience for the Lord and most other things actually. I can even be frustrated when a friend reminds me of Habakkuk 2:3 "For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false, though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay." That seems to be the hard part, waiting for knowledge and the unfolding of Gods plan in our lives.

He is patient with us, just think of the parable of the prodigal son. He waits for our return, and is ready to forgive our transgressions. "Praise be his patience for I am slow to repentance." A parent learns quickly to be patient or they will surely combust. A gardener has patience: change so slow it is hard to measure but over time the result can be great beauty and nourishment. I had an orchid which didn't bloom for three years. It didn't seem to want to or need to; just content being a sprig of leaves. Many looked at it and contemplated throwing it out thinking it was a lost cause. Now it finally shines with beauty that rewards the patient soul. Everyday I see it when making my morning coffee and am grateful that I persevered. My grandmother prayed the rosary for years that I would turn my life around, I could see she was happy God found a way for me to have a purpose. Patience is supported by hope born in an abiding trust in God. Hopefully all of our spiritual journeys, unique to us, will lead to this faith.

The History of Eucharistic Adoration: Development of Doctrine in the Catholic Church

What did Pope Gregory VII (life: 1020/25 – 1085) teach about the Eucharist?

From EWTN, "Gregory's teaching on the Real Presence was quoted verbatim in Pope Paul VI's historic document Mysterium Fidei (1965) to meet a new challenge to the Eucharist in our day--very similar to what happened in the eleventh century.

"I believe in my heart and openly profess that the bread and wine placed upon the altar are, by the mystery of the sacred prayer and the words of the Redeemer, substantially changed into the true and life-giving flesh and blood of Jesus Christ our Lord, and that after the consecration, there is present the true body of Christ which was born of the Virgin and offered up for the salvation of the world, hung on the cross and now sits at the right hand of the Father, and that there is present the true blood of Christ which flowed from his side. They are present not only by means of a sign and of the efficacy of the Sacrament, but also in the very reality and truth of their nature and substance."


With this profession of faith, the churches of Europe began what can only be described as a Eucharistic Renascence. Processions of the Blessed Sacrament were instituted; prescribed acts of adoration were legislated; visits to Christ in the pyx were encouraged; the cells of anchoresses had windows made into the church to allow the religious to view and adore before the tabernacle. An early ordinal of the Carmelites included the words "for the devotion of those in the choir" when referring to the reservation of the species."

From the eleventh century on, devotion to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle became more and more prevalent in the Catholic world. At every stage in this development, members of religious orders of men and women took the lead. The Benedictine Lanfranc, as Archbishop of Canterbury, introduced from France into England numerous customs affecting the worship of the Real Presence."

Letter from Cardinal Mundelein

One of the oldest items the archive corner has is a letter written by Cardinal Mundelein from 1918. It's a letter of assignment for Father Smith to be an Associate Pastor at Saint Finbar. 

Centennial Garden



Our centennial garden, located on the corner of Summit and Ridge Terrace, is celebrating its 13th year of existence. Established in 2011 the garden team grows vegetables and herbs that are distributed to our food pantry clients during each month from May to October. Vegetables grown include lettuce, radishes, carrots, onions, tomatoes, peppers, beans, cucumbers and zucchini.

In the Spring, with the supervision of Mike Polley and his garden team, Social Service Ministry puts together a "sponsor a raised bed in our parish vegetable garden" program where parishioners and SPC school kids can participate. Sponsoring means planting, watering, and harvesting your own 4'x4' raised bed throughout the growing season. This program has been especially popular for the kids as they not only help to feed the hungry, but they earn service hours for their participation. Aside from growing vegetables, the garden is a quiet place where it is easy to pray. A statue of St. Fiacre, patron saint of gardeners, is there to remind us he is making intercessions for us to God our Father, asking Him to bless our garden with His verdant blessings. Amen!
