Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

Saint Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, our second reading this week, has a little phrase that really struck me when I prayed over it. He says "sing and play to the Lord in your hearts." Here's the whole verse: "And do not get drunk on wine, in which lies debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one

another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father."

It's really an incredible verse if you spend some time with it. Let me parse it out a bit.

Do not get drunk on wine, but be filled with the Holy Spirit. It seems kind of random for Paul to mention getting drunk on wine when he's talking about spiritual things. But getting drunk was a big deal for people back then, as it is still today. They didn't have Coors Light or whiskey back then; wine was the main alcoholic beverage, hence Paul mentioning wine specifically. (Substitute food, drugs, impure material, or whatever else if 'wine' isn't your struggle.) Getting drunk is ultimately an escape. It is a self-centered action. We choose what we want to be filled by, and that filler isn't grounded in love and self-gift. We have a need in our hearts. Paul recognizes this, which is why he encourages us to turn to the Holy Spirit and not to wine to fill that need.

Address one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs. When we are filled with the Holy Spirit we find ourselves inebriated with love. We grace the people around us. It doesn't mean we literally go around singing to people all the time, "I gave my love a cherry..." But it's as if we were. Think of a lover singing a song to another. This is what Paul means when he tells us to address one another in the form of songs. Praise the person and don't be angry with them or take from them. Love is the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

Sing and play to the Lord in your hearts. This is the humdinger. There's something free, fun, and deeply life-giving when you are all alone and sing out loud. You don't care if your voice doesn't sound great. You're not there to impress or entertain anyone. You are in the moment, totally embodied, and one with the Spirit. When we pray, we should have a similar feeling. Time with God shouldn't feel forced or boring.

It should come naturally from your heart and be what you need, just like whatever song you are singing is a song you enjoy. God likes all forms of music. I would love to hear what kind of music you enjoy—both the actual songs/bands you listen to, and your style of prayer.

Give thanks always. Enough said.

Community Reflections



"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." (John 6:51)
Park Ridge has become quite the dining destination.

You can get anything here from spaghetti to sushi to shepherd's pie.

While there are many different foods that can satisfy our physical hunger, we learn in the Scriptures today that there is only one food that can satisfy our spiritual hunger.

We are created with a hunger for God, called the "Holy Longing."

Without God, we are empty. We will never be satisfied no matter how hard we try to fill this space with something other-than-God.

Jesus is the One sent by God to feed this hunger. His flesh is the "true food" and His blood is the "true drink" which alone can satisfy the spiritual emptiness within us.

He says it over and over in today's Gospel.
This is the fourth consecutive Sunday where we have heard from the challenging Bread of Life discourse in John's Gospel.

Jesus has been preaching in ways that strain the ability to understand and believe.

In last week's Gospel, the Jews were "murmuring" about this teaching.

This Sunday, the Jews are "quarreling" about this teaching.

Jesus' words seem too hard to comprehend. Belief in this sacred mystery is a challenge. That is why we say we "practice our faith" and not "master our faith." Truth is, if we ever "mastered" our faith, we would never miss this Eucharistic meal. If we had perfect faith, we wouldn't get off our knees when we are in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. There is no greater news than the Eucharist we receive being the Body of Christ.

Eucharist is an encounter where our senses – seeing, touching and tasting – are all deceived.

For the bread we eat is no mere bread, and the wine we drink is no mere wine, but the real nourishment of Christ's body and blood.

So let us simply embrace the sacred mystery of the Real Presence of Christ as divine food that satisfies our spiritual hunger.

It is the source of eternal life.



This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. Past participants have said how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or families have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to stuff their grief instead of allowing God to do the work that is needed. Confidentiality is a big part of this program.


