Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

The last karaoke song I performed (no, it wasn't last week...it was back in college, if I recall correctly) was "Cheeseburger in Paradise" by Jimmy Buffett. It's among my long list of most embarrassing moments. I remember in particular trying to get the crowd going during the part of the song where he chants:

"I like mine with lettuce and tomato // Heinz 57 and french fried potatoes // Big kosher pickle and a cold draft beer // Well, good God almighty which way do I steer..."

When I was praying in the Adoration Chapel with this Sunday's Gospel this song kept popping into my head. I took it as a sign from the Holy Spirit that I had to write about it.

First of all, the song is fun. There's something easy and light about it. Sometimes we can make the Eucharist very hard and burdensome. It can be the mental gymnastics we play trying to figure out the Real Presence. Is this really Jesus here? If so, then why don't I feel anything? It can be the argumentation we get into with others and other denominations who don't believe in the Real Presence. It can be the anguish we feel about whether or not to receive communion because we haven't gone to confession. Receive on the hand or receive on the tongue? Why can't non-Catholics receive communion? And on and on with issues around the Eucharist. The song in our head becomes some intense dirge. Now, I'm not saying treat communion haphazardly or don't care, but we should try to ease up and feel some joy around the Body of Christ. Our Lord is the Bread of Life, not the Bread of Death.

Second of all, with the song, the lyrics can be viewed spiritually, if you choose (Jimmy Buffett was raised Catholic). Replace "Cheeseburger" with "Eucharist" and now we've got ourselves a communion hymn. I won't go through all the lyrics, but just the refrain:

Cheeseburger in paradise Heaven on Earth with an onion slice Not too particular, not too precise I'm just a cheeseburger in paradise

Keep it simple when you go to Mass and receive communion. Don't try to have it all figured

out in your head and don't let communion be a point of contention. Focus on Jesus who is giving himself to you and the beautiful love he wants to pour into your heart. And I pray Jimmy Buffett, God rest his soul, is enjoying not a cheeseburger, but Eucharist in Paradise.

Congratulations to our faculty, students, and parents on a successful **first week of school.** We are excited to see everyone back and our campus humming once again with the smiling faces of our children.

Tomorrow, Monday, August 26th at 7:30pm is the **Candlelight Rosary.** And a reminder that our **parish picnic** will be Sunday, September 8th following the noon Mass. We'll have food in the gym, an ice cream truck in the parking lot, and some light entertainment (not me doing karaoke).

Community Reflections



For where there are two or three gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them. -Matthew 18:20

One thing I've noticed over the years is how Catholics can have the propensity to privatize the practice of faith. We may assemble for the Holy Mass but then every other element or practice of faith in our spiritual endeavors is solitary. In my experience having spent seven years in Seminary training between St. Josephs college seminary and Mundelein, prayer in community was celebrated in all its richness. We held each other accountable and supported each other; shared ideas and feedback and inspired each other. I felt it and would reflect warmly on the reality that without the support of my brother seminarians I would not have built the foundation in prayer which has helped me in my priestly ministry.

So, what I am exhorting you to consider today is to have conversations with those around you about, prayer, scripture, or where you're at in your spiritual life. We have our men's, women's, and bible study groups starting up in the next few weeks. That is a wise way to open a dialogue and learn from each other and the experts who provide content as food for thought. Beyond that, ask questions. How do you pray? How do you incorporate scripture in your spiritual practices? Where do you notice God working in your life? How do you deal with distraction in prayer? Curiosity and listening are great skills to learn from each other and share wisdom. When we do this, we embrace the desire of Christ to see people gather in his name so he can bless them and that we may be united as he is with the Father.

"Perpetual adoration is the most beautiful thing you could ever think of doing. ... Imagine for a moment that we are living in Jesus' time and He has invited us to visit with Him and spend some quiet time getting to know Him better. Being aware who He was, we would be humbled and honored by such an invitation. The good news is that Jesus is here with us today — body, blood, soul and divinity — in the Holy Eucharist. Although Jesus comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine, his presence is as real to us now as He was flesh-and-blood-real to his disciples when he walked this earth. He can perform miracles, heal us, teach us and love us. We can talk to him and he can speak to us."

"Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration."

She summarized, "The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth."

Capital Campaign

On August 14, 2024, Fr. James and St. Paul of the Cross hosted Cardinal Cupich for the Archdiocese Generation to Generation Answer the Call Capital Campaign Launch Event.

SPC opened its doors to welcome more than 200 guests not only from SPC, but also, St. Edward, St. John Vianney, St. Peter Damian, St. Theresa and St. Juliana parishes. Guests were invited to tour our SPC campus with visits to the Upper Church, Holy Family Chapel, Food Pantry, Parish Garden and Adoration Chapel. Student volunteers guided guests and answered questions.

Fr. James welcomed guests, offered an opening prayer and introduced Cardinal Cupich who spoke about the Campaign and his commitment to the Archdiocese. The Cardinal also welcomed an open Question & Answer session and was candid in his responses.

Our parish goal is \$2.705 million and when reached, one half of the funds will be applied to a new parish meeting space and outside Stations of the Cross. Overall, the Archdiocese will apply the raised pledges to the priests pension/healthcare fund, student scholarships for Catholic education, and overall assistance to those in need in the Archdiocese.

PLANNED GIVING

Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- 2. The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
