## Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

I've been reading several books about the American Civil War, one of my old pastimes. When it comes to military history, we often learn about the battles and the tactics that led to the victory or defeat in the battle itself: this general acted decisively and took the high ground; that commander positioned

his artillery in such and such a way; the army counterattacked in the evening when the fighting was supposed to be finished; and so forth. While all these moves are important to the victory of the battle, there is something more significant outside of the battle itself that will lead to victory of a campaign and even the entire war. That is the *supply train* for the army. Does the army have enough food, clothing, munitions to fight and advance?

This is an unglamorous part of a war effort, and one that Civil War books often won't discuss in detail, but it was the reason for the Union's victory in the Civil War. The Union army was able to stay fed and soldiers were able to be supplied with shoes and weapons. For an army of 50,000 or 100,000 men in the field, this was no easy feat, and food and clothing is something we take for granted today as easily accessible. But not so back then. The Union generals, particularly U.S. Grant, were well organized and could keep their armies sustained. Sure, they might have lost individual battles against the better Confederate tacticians, but the Union army could keep up the advance because their army was fortified with food from their supply depot. This was a tremendous weakness of the Confederate generals, their organizational ability, and one of the reasons for the South's defeat.

Moses was the commander of a 600,000 man army in the desert. Some think it was closer to 1 million people, if you include the women and children. When they ran out of food and supplies, some of the Israelite leaders called for Moses' removal, thinking he was a poor general. Moses had told the people specifically when they left Egypt to take very little with them, except for the few unleavened loaves of bread that had been baked. This wasn't poor planning on Moses' part. Just the opposite. He trusted in God, trusted that God would supply the food. And our first reading for this Sunday is God following through on his promise. God rains down the manna from

heaven to feed the army. This reliance on God is the real food that will feed the Israelites and allow them to be victorious.

We are now the army in the field. We need to be supplied. The Eucharist at Sunday Mass is our food. This is what will allow us to persevere, much more than any skill we take to the actual battles we face.

On Wednesday, August 14th in the evening we will be hosting here at St. Paul of the Cross in the gym a capital campaign event for us and other parishes in our pilot wave of the Archdiocesan Capital Campaign. Cardinal Cupich will be present to give a more detailed explanation of the campaign, and drinks and heavy hors d'oeuvres will be served. As I've mentioned in previous bulletins, thank you for your contribution to this campaign. Funds we raise will go to support priest health care and retirement, scholarships for Catholic schools, and building here at our parish outdoor Stations of the Cross and a large meeting space off the parking lot.

Please save the date for our **parish picnic** on Sunday, September 8th at 1pm in the parking lot.

I hope your summer has been nice and you are enjoying these beautiful days of August.

## Community Reflections



"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times..."

The above phrase, penned by Charles Dickens, not only captured the theme of his novel A Tale of Two Cities, but it summarizes my summer experience in a nutshell, too.

As part of our time in seminary, I am participating in a 12-week program as a hospital chaplain near Denver. On weekdays from 8:00 – 5:00 I get to spend time visiting with patients and their loved ones. We also receive classroom education through lectures and reading assignments during the summer on how to best provide emotional and spiritual support to people who are suffering.

For the past two months, I have witnessed tangible experiences of the cross. I will never forget listening to two patients (on separate visits) describe the abuse they have suffered at the hands of family members, and how their faith life has struggled because of it. The experience of a mother in the ICU coming close to dying mere days after losing her 6 year-old-son is also forever seared into my mind. So many people suffer so much, and although it's the patients and their families who endure that pain, I am convinced that we are called to walk with people and trust in God's care for them, while also showing them God's love at all times.

On the other hand... these "worst times" can also be the "best times," because with every cross comes a Resurrection. It has been a huge privilege to walk with patients whose Faith grows through their suffering. I'll always remember the peacefulness that one patient showed me during her cancer diagnosis, and how richly that taught me about what a true relationship with Jesus looks like. Being present to receive patients' stories as they recount their spiritual journey is a treasure I'll also always cherish from this summer. It's been a privilege to be a deacon, and I'm looking forward to serving you all at SPC and listening to your summer experiences of being the light of Christ for others.





This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. Past participants have said how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or families have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to stuff their grief instead of allowing God to do the work that is needed. Confidentiality is a big part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort, and help for grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling and going through. 

#### Parish Records

Everyone who registered as a new parishioner since November of 2004 has received a confirmation email/letter that (among other things) states, "Never hesitate to contact me with your questions, comments, and concerns." That offer still stands.

When new parishioners register, they are added to the parish database which is constantly updated by you; our personnel in the rectory, catechesis program, and school; and the post office. In addition to contact information (addresses, phones, emails) sacraments are also recorded. Fun fact: The church where you are baptized keeps the official record of all of your sacraments.

Your record in our system is only as accurate as the information provided. Let me know if anything has changed since you registered so I can update your record accordingly and keep our database as current as possible. If you have any questions about the data saved in your record, contact me so we can ensure it is up to date.

At the time of registration, you advised of your preference to contribute via a monthly packet of mailed envelopes or to give online. Any time you want to change the current arrangement, contact me to receive or to discontinue envelopes. If you give online and still receive our envelopes, kindly advise me to stop your envelope mailings so we can save that cost. To give online via credit card or bank transfer, please reach out to our Director of Finance, Sandy Labouvie, who is happy to help you with this transition.

I also maintain the SPC School Alumni Database. Before and after your class reunions, let's exchange information!

The best part of my job is working directly with our parishioners! I look forward to hearing from YOU!


