Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

The Pharisees attack Jesus and his disciples in today's Gospel because Jesus and crew didn't wash their hands before the meal. Was it that the Pharisees were clean freaks? Well, yes and no. Clean freaks not in the sense of sanitation like we would understand it today with germs and illnesses, but clean freaks

in the sense of trying to maintain a pure soul.

Jewish law held such that if one came in contact with something or someone unclean-a dead person, a Gentile, a piece of pork (pork was a staple food of pagan cultures, so the assumption was that coming in contact with pork meant you were coming in contact with a pagan person), a piece of furniture that had been made or touched by a pagan, and so forth-the Israelite became unclean. The Israelite had to ritually purify himself as a result. Well, over time, there were so many items that were considered unclean that it was just assumed the person had come in contact with something that made them unclean, hence the Israelite had to constantly purify himself, even if he was unaware of specifically having touched something. The Pharisees don't see Jesus purifying himself, so they think he is breaking the law and is unclean.

Jesus doesn't become unclean by people or things. He makes them clean.

That's the quick lesson here. I've mentioned this before, but we often "sanitize" our prayer because we are either ashamed or think the material is unfit for Jesus. Jesus has heard and seen everything. He can handle what's on your heart.

Sometimes when I go over to a house for dinner or a pastoral visit, the family will apologize because the house is a mess. Or I can tell they worked hard all day to clean the house before my appearance, as the house looks like something out of a magazine. I always tell the person, "don't worry about it. I've seen everything." I have. I don't care that the house is dirty or whatever. When I go home to visit my parents or my siblings there are toys, clothes, and dishes from my nieces and nephews everywhere. I don't judge my family or avoid going home. It's life. So, I give you permission to have a dirty house. Just remove any Packers paraphernalia, otherwise you're fine.

Whatever is going on in your heart or mind is

life, our Lord understands. In fact, I actually think he wants you to be dirty so he can exercise love and mercy. Don't sweep your garbage under the rug. One final point. Isn't it fascinating that the only people Jesus ever really "yells" at, if you can even call it yelling, are the Pharisees—those who are the most "religious" and follow the rules perfectly? I won't say anymore, other than I know I need to pray about that and I imagine you do too.

Community Reflections



As we take time to enjoy Labor Day weekend, what can we learn from the Catholic Church about work and labor?

We know that Jesus was raised by his foster father, Saint Joseph, who was a skilled carpenter and likely taught Jesus the details of his craft. Within that relationship, we can be fairly sure that Saint Joseph also taught Jesus that our labor, both at a job or within our household, adds to our human dignity when we work in order to give glory to God. Furthermore, it is likely that Jesus' mother, Mary, taught Jesus the beauty of the balance of work and being with others. Our work is only fruitful as long as it is ordered towards glorifying God so that we can improve our souls and help ourselves and others around us get to Heaven.

This past summer while working as a hospital chaplain, a hidden grace was being able to see many of the inner-workings of the medical profession. I watched doctors and nurses revive a patient over the course of an hour as they suffered a heart attack, then in the next hour I watched the janitorial staff clean the room so that it could be ready for serving the next patient. I watched the reception desk welcome people and get them entered into the system before a procedure, then I watched the patient's loved ones go to the hospital café for a coffee and lunch served by the food prep staff.

Everybody is called by the Lord to use our gifts and talents in the form of work which serves others in some capacity. When we do that, when we see all of our labor through the lens of service, no matter how direct it may be, we realize that we are all called to be members of the Body of Christ. That is what it means to be a Eucharistic people: we sacrifice for each other, we work to serve each other, and we labor in order to bring our soul and other souls to Heaven with Christ. A Divine Invitation: Jesus Wants YOU!

Imagine Jesus eagerly waiting for you. Our time in Adoration starts with Jesus' deep desire to be with us. He is there, longing for your presence, not just as a silent observer but as a beloved friend who cherishes every moment you spend with Him.

Battling Distractions: You're Not Alone

We've all been there—sitting in front of the Blessed Sacrament and finding our minds wandering. Msgr. Shea reassures us that this is normal. Instead of feeling guilty, focus on Jesus' love and desire for you. This shift can help calm your heart and mind, allowing you to be more present.

The Power of Silence: Let Go and Listen

Silence can be daunting, but it's in these quiet moments that God whispers to our souls. While it's good to pray the Rosary or read scripture, don't be afraid to simply sit in silence. Let Jesus speak to your heart, filling you with His peace and love.

Building a Secure Bond with God

Like a child feels secure with a parent, your time in Adoration strengthens your bond with God. Msgr. Shea likens this to developing a deep sense of security and confidence in God's love, helping you navigate life with faith and trust.

St. John Vianney: "He looks at me, and I look at Him." It's about being with Jesus, letting His gaze transform you.






