Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

Saint Paul reveals something personal in his second letter to the Corinthians, our second reading today, something about which scholars have discussed and speculated for the last two thousand years. "That I, Paul, might not become too elated, because of the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was

given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated."

What was this "thorn in the flesh" to which Paul was referring? Was it something physical, like a lisp or a speech impediment or a limp? Was it something more emotional or psychological, like anxiety or depression or anger? Was it a relative who was troubled, an old friend from his days prior to his conversion who painfully reminded him of his past, or an annoying confrere in Christianity? We're not sure. All we know is that it really bothered Paul and that he finally learned to accept it. He writes, "Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness'."

Can you relate to Paul? Do you have a "thorn in the flesh"? Would anyone know what it is?

A thorn is much different than, say, a sword or a bullet or something more serious. A thorn is painful and annoying, but it is not life-threatening. Cancer, for instance, would not qualify as your "thorn in the flesh." It's too serious. The pathetic play of the Chicago Cubs of late wouldn't qualify as a thorn either. It's too light. The Cubs would be more like a mosquito bite.

When I was praying about this myself, my first thought was that I don't really have a thorn in the flesh in my life. My life is pretty good and, again, my "complaints" wouldn't qualify as thorns—they'd be more like mosquito bites at best. Probably more on the level of a cicada. But praying about it some more, and realizing Paul wouldn't have included this personal tidbit for no reason, I do see that I have a thorn in the flesh. And this is a good thing. For, like Paul said, this has forced me to confront my weakness. I can't remove this thorn myself. I have to rely on God and his grace. The weakness thus becomes a point of union with God.

When we are confronted by our thorns in the flesh, instead of getting angry or depressed about it,

or spending energy strategizing about how to remove it, the invitation is to pray about it. We are called to surrender to God and ask him to give us strength to deal appropriately with the thorn. This gives us humility and it also puts us in a position to listen to God in a deep way. God usually speaks comforting words to us and shows us his plan; that the thorn is no mark against us and that it is actually a gift.

Paul says the thorn "was given to him." That's pretty remarkable. It's not just some random thing happening in his life he has to pray about. God gave him a thorn. We like to only think God gives us roses, but, no, he gives us thorns too. And those thorns become our crowns.

Catholic Reflections



A Note on Miracles

"Of the fact and evidence of the supernatural I will speak afterwards. Here we are only concerned with this clear point; that in so far as the liberal idea of freedom can be said to be on either side in the discussion about miracles, it is obviously on the side of miracles. Reform or (in the only tolerable sense) progress means simply the gradual control of matter by mind. A miracle simply means the swift control of matter by mind. If you wish to feed the people, you may think that feeding them miraculously in the wilderness is impossible—but you cannot think it illiberal. If you really want poor children to go to the seaside, you cannot think it illiberal that they should go there on flying dragons; you can only think it unlikely. A holiday, like Liberalism, only means the liberty of man. A miracle only means the liberty of God. You may conscientiously deny either of them, but you cannot call your denial a triumph of the liberal idea. The Catholic Church believed that man and God both had a sort of spiritual freedom. Calvinism took away the freedom from man. but left it to God. Scientific materialism binds the Creator Himself; it chains up God as the Apocalypse chained the devil. It leaves nothing free in the universe. And those who assist this process are called the "liberal theologians."

This, as I say, is the lightest and most evident case. The assumption that there is something in the doubt of miracles akin to liberality or reform is literally the opposite of the truth. If a man cannot believe in miracles there is an end of the matter; he is not particularly liberal, but he is perfectly honorable and logical, which are much better things. But if he can believe in miracles, he is certainly the more liberal for doing so; because they mean first, the freedom of the soul, and secondly, its control over the tyranny of circumstance. Sometimes this truth is ignored in a singularly naive way, even by the ablest men. For instance, Mr. Bernard Shaw speaks with a hearty old-fashioned contempt for the idea of miracles, as if they were a sort of breach of faith on the part of nature: he seems strangely unconscious that miracles are only the final flowers of his own favorite tree, the doctrine of the omnipotence of will. Just in the same way he calls the desire for immortality a paltry selfishness, forgetting that he has just called the desire for life a healthy and heroic selfishness. How can it be noble to wish to make one's life infinite and vet mean to wish to make it immortal? No, if it is desirable that man should triumph over the cruelty of nature or custom, then miracles are certainly desirable."
















HELP US SUPPORT PRIEST HEALTH CARE & RETIREMENT
AND BUILD A NEW MEETING SPACE

We'd like to announce the new Archdiocesan capital campaign called Generation to Generation: Answer the Call. Our parish has been given a goal of \$2.7 million to raise. Half of those funds will go to supporting priest health care and retirement, seminary education, scholarships for Catholic education, among other items. The other half of those funds we will use to build a large meeting space off the main parking lot and adjacent to the gym (the current grassy area). While we are blessed with many ministries and groups who meet at our parish, we are unfortunately challenged with a lack of meeting space, and a lack of a large meeting space. This new, handicap accessible building would allow for more of our groups to meet, and would be used as well by our school, which is also at maximum capacity. Secondly, with the funds raised we will build outdoor stations of the cross-either 7 or 14 standing pillars composed of red-face brick with gray stone trim, to match the exterior of our church, around the perimeter of our campus down Northwest Highway, Washington Avenue, Summit Avenue, and Ridge Terrace. Not only would this be a fine architectural addition to our already beautiful grounds, but parishioners would now be able to pray the Way of the Cross on any day at any time. It is our hope too that pedestrians, drivers, visitors, and other seekers would stop and pray before these monuments, and have their hearts inflamed with love for the Lord who died for them. We will be reaching out with more information in the coming weeks. Thank you in advance for your prayers and your support of this campaign.





The Archive Corner would like to present two of our oldest flyers. The first is a raffle to benefit the Sisters of Mercy, who taught at Saint Paul of the Cross from the 1920s through the 1970s. The second is a flyer for a carnival that was held across the street, which at the time was the St. Vincent Villas. Today, this area is home to a medical building, Whole Foods, and townhomes.

St. Paul of the Cross Rectory

July, 1934

It had been customary for the children of the School to conduct a Punch Board Raffle each year for the benefit of the Sisters of Mercy. This year this method of raising funds was discontinued at the request of some of the parents of the children who agreed to obtain an equal sum of money by other means. The school year closed and nothing materialized from this promise. No funds were raised.

In order not to have the Sisters suffer a loss as a consequence of this failure of action, I have taken this means of a Drawing for Cash Prizes and earnestly ask your cooperation in making this benefit a success. There are ten tickets at ten cents each or One Dollar for the Book. Surely this is within the reach of everyone.
