# Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

Christ asleep on the boat in the midst of a storm is a beautiful passage for meditation. We hear that "A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up." The apostles on the boat were panicking. Their lives were endangered. Keep in mind that Peter and several of the other

apostles were experienced fishermen. They lived on this sea and had sailed on it countless times. This must have been a pretty bad storm—the worst they had ever seen—to scare them.

Was it just coincidence that Jesus happened to be on the boat in the midst of the worst storm ever? No, I don't think so. I don't think there were many coincidences with our Lord. The apostles were to see something they had never seen before, feel something they had never felt before, be afraid in a way they had never been afraid before, and, best of all, experience relief and salvation the way they had never experienced relief and salvation before. Everything without Christ pales in comparison to life with Christ.

Many of you have faced some serious storms in your life. What was the worst storm ever for you? (If you're in the midst of it, then I'm sorry. Let me know, if you wouldn't mind, so I can pray for you.) What was God like for you in that storm? Was he asleep or was he awake with you?

If you're reading this, then you survived the storm. There might be some scars and damage, but you're here. God helped you, even if he appeared to be asleep. And you're better off for having experienced that storm. God gave something very special to you, just like he did those apostles. He doesn't just lead anyone into the "storm of the century."

We are looking forward to the **Young Adult Gathering** this Tuesday, June 25th at 7pm at Harp and Fiddle in Park Ridge. We hosted this event several months ago and there was a great turnout of young adults from all over the Chicagoland area and even some from Milwaukee. Please spread the word and invite your friends and children.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is beginning a new Archdiocesan-wide **capital campaign** called

Generation to Generation: Answer the Call. You may recall the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign ten years ago. This campaign is very similar. Our parish has been given a goal of \$2.7 million to raise. Half of those funds will go to supporting priest health care and retirement, seminary education, scholarships for Catholic education, among other items. The other half of those funds we will use to build a large meeting space off the main parking lot and adjacent to the gym (the current grassy area). While we are blessed with many ministries and groups who meet at our parish, we are unfortunately challenged with a lack of meeting space, and a lack of a large meeting space. This new, handicap accessible building would allow for more of our groups to meet, and would be used as well by our school, which is also at maximum capacity. Secondly, with the funds raised, we will build outdoor stations of the cross-either 7 or 14 standing pillars composed of red-face brick with gray stone trim, to match the exterior of our church, around the perimeter of our campus down Northwest Highway, Washington Avenue, Summit Avenue, and Ridge Terrace. Not only would this be a fine architectural addition to our already beautiful grounds, but parishioners would now be able to pray the Way of the Cross on any day at any time. It is our hope too that pedestrians, drivers, visitors, and other seekers would stop and pray before these monuments, and have their hearts inflamed with love for the Lord who died for them. Saint Paul of the Cross himself said. "Oh blessed is that soul that remains crucified with Jesus Christ" (April 2, 1750).

I have already met with several parishioners who have generously given their support to this campaign, and so we are off to a great start. I will be reaching out to more of you over the summer and will give you more information on these projects. We will also include more information in the bulletin in the upcoming weeks, including renderings of the new meeting space and outdoor stations.

We have a great parish and this campaign is a wonderful opportunity to add to our vitality and continue our mission of serving the Lord and one another. Please keep the campaign in your prayers and thank you in advance for your support.

# Community Reflections



In my spiritual reading recently, I came across this image presented by St. Peter Chrysologus which plays off the scripture from Ephesians 6: 10-20 (put on the armor of God...): "Each of us is called to be both a sacrifice to God and his priest. Do not forfeit what divine authority confers on you. Put on the garment of holiness, gird yourself with the belt of chastity. Let Christ be your helmet. Let the cross on your forehead be your unfailing protection. Your breastplate should be the knowledge of God that he himself has given you. Keep burning continually the sweet-smelling incense of prayer. Take up the sword of your spirit. Let your heart be an altar. Then with full confidence in God, present your body for sacrifice." I submit this picture for your reflection.

Here is mine. Holiness begins with the cross on your forehead first signed on your forehead during baptism. There you are set apart, consecrated by God for your pilgrimage on earth ultimately seeking to return to your true homeland in heaven. You are given a white garment during baptism and your parents vow to help you bring it unstained to the eternal banquet in heaven. The virtue of chastity is crucial to strive for morally while praying earnestly for the gift of it from God. The evil one uses the allure of the seven deadly sins to distract us and make us wander off the path blazed by Christ and illuminated by the Holy Spirit. The Helmet of Christ is a sign of his desire to protect us from the dangers of the world to help cushion the blow of any falls. We are not without his assistance along the way. Knowledge of scripture and its august teachings is the road map for salvation Christ has willed for us to know for our advantage by the guidance of the Holy spirit. He also willed that Peter would lead his Church and that through his apostolic leadership, his successors, and the Holy saints, the teachings available in the catechism would be our technical support and explanation to help us grow in wisdom. In our heart is a Holy altar where Christ resides, we go to this inner sanctuary to pray and bless him with the incense of our prayer. To be nourished by him who gave everything for us and desires to be in relationship with us in an intimate union. We go out with the sword of the spirit to cut out the vices that prevent this union so that we can visit God in his house and present ourselves in union with Christ on the altar of sacrifice to be consecrated once again and invited into the life of the Trinity.

# **KNOW YOUR MARYVILLE**

### **MISSION**

Maryville is a child care organization rooted in Catholic social teaching and dedicated to the preservation of the dignity of children at every age. Our mission is to protect children and strengthen families while helping them reach their fullest potential by empowering their intellectual, spiritual, moral and emotional growth.

Maryville Academy, one of Chicagoland's oldest social service organizations, began its 140th anniversary in July 2023. We are full of gratitude for all the Lord has accomplished for children, families and communities over the years through the dedication of countless clergy, religious, lay personnel and community partners. As an apostolate of the Archdiocese of Chicago, we share in the Church's works of mercy and thank you for the privilege of carrying out our mission to protect and serve children and families in your name and with your help. We appreciate this opportunity to reacquaint you with or introduce you to "your" Maryville.

Saint Mary's Training School was begun in 1883 by Chicago's first Archbishop, Reverend Patrick A. Feehan, and was renamed Maryville Academy by the children's vote in 1950. It has provided a home, education, career training and therapeutic care while upholding the dignity of each child. Over the years, as the needs and circumstances of youth changed, we responded with best-practice methods and programming. Yet we have held true to the essential mission, striving to make a positive difference.

Maryville is dedicated to protecting children and strengthening families through our comprehensive services in four key areas – Family Services, Residential Services, Healthcare Services, and Educational Services. These services are available in Bartlett, Berwyn, Chicago, Des Plaines, and Niles. Many of our programs are community-based and are designed to be of assistance to you, or those you know or serve:

- Catholic Youth Organization (CYO): 312-491-3534—provides a safe and positive environment for young athletes in Cook and Lake Counties through sports leagues/camps, open gyms and tournaments.
- Children's Healthcare Center: 773-205-3606—is a welcoming, supportive facility that
  offers 24-hour nursing care for children who are medically fragile and technology
  dependent. The nursing staff gives parent/caregiver training to safely transition the
  children back to their homes.
- Crisis Nursery: 24-Hour Helpline 773-205-3637—one of seven in IL and the only one serving Cook and Lake counties. It offers free child care services to parents with children under age 7 who are experiencing an emergency or crisis. It provides a safe, secure and loving environment for 4–72 hours in one stay and up to 30 days a year.
- Family Behavioral Health Clinic: 847-390-3004—has counseling services, DUI evaluations, risk education (English, Spanish, and Polish, in-person or telehealth appointments), smoking/vaping cessation services and play therapy. Medicaid and private insurance (not HMO) are accepted. NARCAN training for groups is available.























- Maryville Academy Mother's Recovery Home Network (Saint Monica and Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes) 312-491-3500 | 872-250-9720—is a recovery and unification program that helps moms become sober, self-sufficient and independent so they can care for their children and keep them safe. Moms 18-35 years of age, accompanied by children younger than 11, receive recovery, vocational and parenting coaching. Referral is via the Department of Children and Family Services' INTACT unit or from an assessment by our Family Behavioral Health Clinic.
- Charles H. Walsh Sr. Academy & Career Tech High School: 847-390-3020—opened in November 2023 and continues Maryville Jen School's founding vision of preparing diverse learners to enter high-demand trades or be college-ready for a successful future. Walsh Academy has an open enrollment policy and welcomes students 14-22 who are within a one-hour driving distance from the Academy. It is a leader in providing a comprehensive curriculum that offers academics, integrated social-emotional learning, and career-technical educational instruction for students.

Maryville also continues to provide residential programs: Casa Imani and St. Mary of Celle are therapeutic homes for parenting and pregnant adolescent girls who experienced childhood trauma and are currently in the care of DCFS. Casa Salama Home for girls, 13-20, in DCFS care, diagnosed with cognitive and mental challenges. St. Dominic Savio Home and St. Teresa of Calcutta Home offer clinical care and life skills education for youth aged 14-18 who are referred to Maryville by the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice. Casa Esperanza, St. Rose of Lima, San Francisco and San Juan Diego Homes are short-term homes for newcomer youth displaced by war, violence or trauma. St. Gabriel Home is a long-term group home for male newcomer youth 12-17.

**Maryville Golf Academy**, one of Maryville's family services programs, teaches life lessons inherent in golf to Maryville children and youth in underserved Chicago neighborhoods and helps them develop as players, caddies and clubmakers.

Maryville is blessed with 500 employees. Our funding comes from government contracts, grants, donations and fundraising. We are proud and appreciative of our Maryville staff and grateful for the donors, volunteers, faith communities and organizations who support our work.

We invite you to partner with us by praying each day for Maryville's children, families and staff; holding a drive or taking up a collection to benefit Maryville; supporting our fundraisers; becoming a "Maryville Ambassador" to connect us with your parish; joining our team (go to maryvilleacademy.org for job opportunities); volunteering for a few hours each week (please visit our website to apply); contacting DCFS for information to become foster or adoptive parents--some of our Maryville children need families; or inviting our outreach coordinator to speak to your faith community or parish ministry or group about Maryville.

Thank you for the privilege of serving with you to strengthen and help children and families so they are safe, healthy and supported in growing to their full potential. 
