Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

As we start the month of May, Mary's month, I can't help but notice the presence of the Blessed Mother in our readings this Sunday. But wait, you say, Mary is never mentioned once in any of the three readings! Settle down, my friend. Mary doesn't need to be explicitly mentioned in the text. Her influence is clear.

Mary spent her time living with the apostles after the Resurrection. Surely she would have told Peter and the others about Jesus' earlier life. Surely, wise woman and mother that she was, she would have given advice to Peter and the others.

Peter's decision to baptize Cornelius, a pagan, was prompted by Mary. Peter's initial reaction was to not bring Cornelius into the Church, since he was uncircumcised. But just like my mom told me as a child to never exclude anyone and to invite over even some of the not-so-popular classmates, Peter would have been told by Mary to be welcoming and kind.

John, the author of both our second reading and the Gospel, took Mary into his home. They lived together in Ephesus before Mary's passing. John writes, "Remain in my love...this is my commandment, love one another as I love you...it was not you who chose me, but I who chose you" (Jn 15:9-17). Also: "everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God...God sent his only son into the world so that we might have life through him" (1 Jn 4:7-10). Sounds very motherly to me.

Mary was chosen by God to not only give birth to Jesus, but to play a significant role in the church and in the lives of all Christians. The apostles would not have done what they did-the Church would not have become what it became-had Mary not been present. She really was the queen.

I find myself turning to Mary all the time. When I'm struggling over a difficult decision, I go to the chapel, close my eyes, and put myself in Mary's presence. She usually takes away the pressure that I'm putting on myself 'to get it right' and then the answer comes, along with the strength to do it. When I feel I'm losing my joy and my life is becoming too routine, too mechanical, I again turn to Mary. Her son said, "May my joy be in you and may your joy be complete." Mary helps me receive that joy. And there are many other examples of how Mary helps me.

She wants to help you. If you can let her into your life, she will influence you. Then we will see her influence over the Church as the early Christians saw it.

This Sunday, being the first of the month, is **Donut Sunday and New Parishioner Sign-Up.** Please stop by the gym after the 9am and 10:30am Masses. We'll also be entertained with the Boy Scout Pinewood Derby.

As I did last year, I've written **reflections on Mary for the month of May** in the bulletin each week. The entire, completed document can also be found online.

There will be a **Wednesday morning scripture seminar** this week, May 8th in the Holy Family Chapel. Everyone is invited to join, even if it is your first time. Coffee and treats are served.

This Wednesday evening is the final **Walking With Purpose** women's spiritual group until the fall. Last Monday evening was the final *That Man is You* men's spiritual group session until the fall. I want to thank all the men and women who participated in these faith groups, and I especially want to thank Will Gohl and Megan Mc-Laughlin for leading these groups.

This Friday, May 10th from 7-8pm in the upper church we will be hosting **Friday Night Lights**. This is an evening of Eucharistic Adoration and music. Teens from our CRUX group will be in attendance, but everyone in the parish is welcome to join us.

A special congratulations to our **seminarian Lee Noel**, who will be ordained a deacon this Friday, May 10th back in Wyoming, his diocese. We look forward to having Lee back with us in the fall and assisting as a seminarian-deacon, the way Deacon Martin Nyberg assisted this year. (Deacon Nyberg's ordination to the priesthood is Saturday, May 18th.)

On Saturday, May 11th we have our second round of **First Communion**, with one Mass at 10am and the second Mass at 1pm. Congratulations to our First Communicants. We are very happy for you and proud of you.

Community Reflections



May is the month dedicated to Mary, making it a prime time for us to contemplate the role of the Mother of God in our Catholic Faith. Specifically, in her role as mediator she is responsible for bringing us into a deeper relationship with Jesus. Sure, we can fulfill our obligations as Catholics without a devotion to Mary, but when we spend time with Mary in prayer, it takes our spiritual life to a whole new level. It's the difference between going on a sight-seeing vacation of Flaming Gorge Canyon in Green River, Wyoming (check out some pictures online then head West and see for yourself; the scenery is breathtaking!) during which you only took pictures from the car vs. setting the phone aside and going on a hike through the canyon and stepping in the river. A relationship with Mary enhances our Faith and brings us into a deeper communion with the Trinity.

As Mother of God, Mary always humbly directed others to follow Jesus because she knew the depth of peace and joy that can be attained when we are in relationship with the Lord... and she wants that for everyone as she continues to intercede for us! We can bring our feelings, desires, petitions, and concerns to Mary in silent prayer. We know she suffered as she watched her Son be crucified and then held His dead body. But we also know that Mary experienced joy when she heard of Jesus' miraculous healings, and likely saw Jesus after His Resurrection. We can relate all our sufferings and joy to Mary and grow closer to her, which in turn brings us closer to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

Lastly, Mary is described as the portal of the Eucharist. As Mother of Jesus, she cooperated with the will of God the Father and brought Christ to us. Now, we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, Who is God the Son, at every Mass in the Eucharist as Mary continues to help bring us into deeper communion with God.

The Potter's Flask: Reflections on the Blessed Virgin Mary Week of May 5th

"The heart of Mary is the beginning of the story: in her heart was performed a secret, what now at Pentecost is open to the gaze of all mankind. The heart of Mary is the original upper room, where redeemed mankind is gathered."

–Hugo Rahner

This illuminated manuscript from a 15th Century French artist of humble origins depicts "the disciples gathered together in prayer, together with Mary, the Mother of Jesus" (Acts 1:14). Mary stands in the apostolic throng, as if she is in a crowded subway. She is not, however, lost in the tumult. Standing above the rest, her head is covered, unlike the others, and her vibrant blue and white clothing stands out from the dull beiges and greens of the apostles. The "Queen of the Apostles" looks down, while the others look up in wonder. Mary is not intrigued by the spectacle. She contains the flame of the Holy Spirit already within her. While Peter and James protect their eyes from the flash of light, Mary prayerfully folds them across her breast, protecting the Spirit in her womb, as she once protected the eternal Word made flesh.

Last month, thousands of men, women, and children across the country stared up at the sky in the middle of the day in amazement. It was not the fire of the Holy Spirit that entranced them, but the partially blocked sun of a solar eclipse. They were fascinated by a ring of electrum in the sky. The earth turned dark for four minutes and then people went back to their daily lives. Not the apostles. The earth brightened during that period of the outpouring of heaven, and their lives were forever changed. Peter and the apostles who once were timid and uneducated in the scriptures now became eloquent masters. They were wedded to the mission of the master. They would never return to their former way of living, never again deny the Lord, never again hide in a locked upper room. A torch was set ablaze in their hearts at Pentecost and the apostles would bring that light to the dark world.

Mary is at the heart of this scene. She is at the heart of the apostles' conversion. The apostles would always have the Holy Spirit within them from here on out. But they would turn to Mary for strength and wisdom time and again subsequently.

In the illuminated manuscript, the Blessed Mother looks both to her heart, where God resides, and to Saint John in the foreground. "Woman, behold your son," Jesus had spoken from the cross. John stands for all of us. Mary looks to us to ensure we too will receive the Holy Spirit; that we too will return to her for strength and wisdom.

Spend this week focusing your eyes on Mary. She will direct you to the real heavens. She will help you peer into eternity. She will still your restless eyes and bodies. She will emblazon the Holy Spirit in your heart. You will be in that upper room and your heart will be open to receiving the Holy Spirit. Your life will be changed and you will have meaning. And you will do as she and the apostles did-increase the Church.

St. Paul of the Cross has 213 children making their First Communion over this weekend and next! These children are gifts to our parish, to the entire Church, to the whole world! We congratulate them and invite all parishioners to pray that our First Communicants will continue to grow in love for Jesus as they receive Him in the Eucharist.



LEAVE A LEGACY TO BRING HOPE TO THE WORLD

Every day, we have the opportunity to be the face of Jesus to others. Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- If you are 72 years old or older, (73 if the account owner reaches age 72 in 2023 or later), the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.


