# Letters from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

Not to be macabre, but if you had to lose one of your senses (sight, sound, smell, touch, taste), which one would you choose? Or, if you could have only one sense, which would it be? I think it was St. Thomas Aquinas who said that the greatest sense is sight, but for you it might be different. White Sox fans wouldn't mind

being blind these days (sorry).

Jesus heals a deaf man in today's Gospel. It's interesting that the crowd brought the man to Jesus. It wasn't the man who approached Jesus on his own, looking for a cure. For some reason the people really wanted this man to be able to hear (and to speak clearly, for he also had a speech impediment). I'm sure it was more than just because they felt bad for him. There was something they wanted this fellow to hear. There was something important they felt this fellow had to say that they wanted to be able to understand.

If you lost one of your senses, would someone today really feel like you were missing out on something and beg Jesus to heal you? Or, to put it another way, does our society really offer something worth seeing, hearing, tasting, touching, smelling? Our *natural* world does: the beautiful sunset, the sounds of a summer rain or birds chirping in the morning, the taste of wild honey, the feel of sand on your feet, the smell of fresh flowers. But our man-made world? Watching a Netflix show, smelling a dumpster, listening to some politician's speech, feeling oily lotion on your hands, tasting a \$12 fast food sandwich? No thanks.

The more we remove ourselves from the natural world and live in the artificial world, the more we lose our need for the senses. Being in relationship with Christ puts us as close as possible to the natural world, for he is the author of all those things of nature. The more we pray and the more we receive the Eucharist, the more our senses are opened and the more we take in real beauty. We'll have more to offer, and, like the deaf man in the Decapolis, people will want to hear what we have to say. drinks, and an ice cream truck in the parking lot, games and prizes for the children, and some light entertainment. ## Introducing Seminarian Gregory Wilk

Hello! I am a seminarian, studying to be a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago. I was assigned to St. Paul of the Cross as part of Mundelein Seminary's parish internship program. I am excited to work with you to bring Jesus to Park Ridge souls.

I grew up with my parents and sister in Arlington Heights attending Our Lady of the Wayside. I went to the University of Illinois majoring in Mechanical Engineering and worked at S&C electric company in Chicago for 5 years. 3 years ago, I was reading the biblical book of Samuel and felt called to be a priest.

This call was challenging because it required leaving a good job and potential marriage. However, I prayed about it for a year and grew excited about preaching the gospel, teaching kids religion, helping poor people, building church community, and consecrating the Eucharist. Taking a leap, I left my career and started seminary where I found God answering these risks with joyful experiences.

One of these joyful experiences was teaching kids Catholicism over the summer with Chicago's Totus Tuus summer camp program. Our 4-person team would go to a new parish every week and teach kids the glorious mysteries of the rosary as well as each tenant in the Apostle's Creed. The camp was fun too with daily theatrical skits and a water fight on the last day. Jesus teaches that we must acquire the heart of a child to enter the kingdom of God. I saw this firsthand with how easily children's faces lit up at the hopeful news of God and eternal life.

I will be at all SPC masses Sunday, September 8 and hope to meet you! I am excited to join such a large parish community and school that is close to my hometown. The Holy Spirit is with us, St. Paul of the Cross Parish!

With our children returning to their studies, there is a soon-to-be Saint that is an inspiration for our young people and all of us, Blessed Carlo Acutis. He will be canonized in 2025.

Carlo was born to Italian parents in London in 1991 and moved to Milan as an infant. He was like any other young boy who enjoyed video games, played the saxophone and loved soccer and dogs.

While his parents were not devout Catholics, Acutis became interested in Catholicism at a young age. He was especially fascinated by the ritual of the Eucharist and often asked his parents to take him to saints' birthplaces and the sites of miracles.

Acutis was fascinated by computers, and taught himself programming from an early age. He created websites with a spiritual focus, including his widely praised database of miracles. He is credited with helping homeless people and defending victims of bullying during his lifetime, and having a hand in two healing miracles after his death.

Carlo used technology to spread devotion to the Eucharist before his death at age fifteen, with what was initially believed to be the flu, but turned out to be leukemia. He died on October 12, 2006, and is already referred to as "God's influencer" and the "patron saint of the internet" for his work cataloging Eucharistic miracles around the world — and soon it will be official. He designed websites for his parish and school, before pursuing an even bigger project: documenting the reported Eucharistic miracles around the world. Acutis ultimately cataloged more than 150 miracles, listing them in over a dozen languages and building out downloadable web pages for each with maps and other visuals. The Eucharistic Miracles of the World became a tool for religious instruction by parishes around the world, and the church hailed it — both then and now — as a way to use modern technology for spiritual good.

"Computer genius, Carlo made his computer an instrument at the service of God and the Internet a way to evangelize, spreading his love for the Holy Eucharist," reads the website of the 2023 World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal, of which Acutis was named a patron."

Before his death, Acutis specifically requested that he be buried in Assisi, because of his devotion to Saint Francis of Assisi, and was reburied there in 2007. Acutis' body was exhumed in 2019 and transferred to a shrine at the Church of St. Mary Major, the very spot where Saint Francis is said to have shed his luxurious clothing for a habit by way of renouncing his wealth.

It remains on display in a glass case, wearing blue jeans, an athletic zip-up and Nike sneakers.




